


Welcome to AKITA!



The land of three beauties: sake, cuisine and scenery

Akita City is blessed with outstanding natural beauty in its mountains, rivers, and sea. Taste the exquisite sake and refined cuisine, pride of the northern lands, and be captivated by the traditional festivals and historical buildings for a true feast for the senses.

A Akita













One of Akita's classic summer festivals. Watch performers balance 12-meter long bamboo poles adorned with a total of 46 paper lanterns using their palms, foreheads, shoulders and waists in an impressive display of skill. The control demonstrated to prevent them falling is truly spectacular.

Venue: Night performances at Kanto Odori Street (August 3-6), daytime performances at Area Nakaichi Nigiwai Square (August 4-6)







Site of Kubota Castle built by Lord Satake of the Satake Clan, a renowned military commander in Akita. Lacking stone walls and castle towers, it's an example of the earthen Hirayama style. The park is a popular spot for cherry blossoms in spring, and foliage in autumn.

Access: About 5 minutes on foot from Akita Station to Pocket Park (east side of Senshu Park)






At a height of 3.65 meters and 20.5 meters wide, the mural painting "Annual Events in Akita" depicting Akita's festivals, lifestyles, and industries is a must-see. The spiral staircase in the entrance hall, unsupported by walls or pillars, is also worthy of attention.

Kiritampo Nabe



Kiritampo are made by applying a layer of lightly crushed rice on skewers and roasting over an open flame. This iconic one pot regional cuisine usually also includes vegetables, mushrooms and local Hinai Jidori chicken.

Akita City Folklore and Performing Art Center 秋田市民俗芸能伝承館

This facility introduces local folk events and performing arts such as kanto bamboo pole-balancing. In the exhibition hall, with its ceiling open to the third floor, visitors can experience the difficulty of the technique by taking up the challenge of balancing bamboo poles.

Tsuchizaki Float Festival 上崎港曳山まつり

July 20-21

A traditional festival passed down in the port of Tsuchizaki in Akita City, Featuring about 20 spectacular floats decorated with statues of powerful warriors moving through the streets to traditional music, this summer festival is a celebration of bravery, and is counted among Akita's three major traditional music festivals.

One of Japan's three famous styles of udon. Ininawa is a hand-stretched, hand-kneaded dried udon with a distinctively smooth consistency, and although relatively thin, has a firm bite.

Catholic Monastery Seitai Hoshikai

カトリック修道院聖体奉什会


This cathedral, built by temple carpenters in a purely Japanese hip-and-gable-style, houses a statue of the Virgin Mary that is said to have wept 101 times from 1975 to 1981.

Port Tower Selion 秋田市ポートタワーセリオン

The Port Tower, made of 6,272 panels of tempered glass, stands 143 meters high. Situated at a height of 100 meters, its observation deck offers 360-degree views of the cityscape of Akita City. There is also seating for couples.

Izakaya (Modern Dining Takeshi) 居酒屋(MODERN DINNING武志)

An izakaya restaurant with a menu based on local Akita cuisine and Japanese food. It has many regular customers, and in addition to the pressed sushi with broiled mackerel, the chef's daily recommended courses are also very popular.

A zoo in a corner of Omorivama Park, with views of the city of Akita. You can get close to the animals—watch Amur tigers leap and eat

Akita Araya Glass Studio

Here you can watch the glass production process up close, including glass-blowing, and then shop for glass artworks. On Saturdays and Sundays, glass-blowing workshops are held. The building also houses a cafe.

Hinai Jidori Oyakodon

Since these chickens are raised free to roam, they have no extra fat content and their flesh gets firm, ensuring rich flavor and aroma with every bite. The soup and eggs of this luxurious oyako-don rice bowl are also made using Hinai-jidori chicken.

Consists of three buildings—the original red brick building, the new building, and a storage facility. The red brick building was built in 1912 as the former head office of the Akita Bank. It is designated as an Important Cultural Property of Japan,


Here visitors can encounter the history and culture of the Tsuchizaki district of Akita City, such as exhibits of actual festival floats (registered as UNESCO Intangible Cultural Heritage) and exhibits of concrete pillars etc. melted by fire during air raids.

Former Akita Domain Satake Clan Villa Gardens (Joshitei)



Home to the Namahage, among cascading landscapes

Located on the Oga Peninsula, surrounded by the Sea of Japan, Oga is known for its bountiful nature and as the home of the Namahage. Visitors are taken aback at the seamless landscapes connecting mountain to sea.























Namahage taiko drumming is a local entertainment that blends Oga's nationally designated Intangible Folk Cultural Property of the Namahage with traditional Japanese drums for an impressive performance.







Regarded as a sacred place of mountain worship since ancient times, this historical shrine is shrouded in a dignified atmosphere. In February every year, the Namahage Sedo Festival is held inside the shrine precincts.

Inside the Fuku no Ya of Oga Hot Spring Village, mini live performances of Akita shamisen (Japanese lute) are held. The sound of the Akita shamisen is a refined and soft three-string harmony that resounds gently in the heart.

An ancient temple established about 830 years ago. There is beautiful flora throughout the seasons in the Japanese garden on the temple grounds, including azaleas, water lilies and autumn foliage. Akagami Shrine Goshado 系种神社五社堂



After climbing the 999 stone steps, which legend suggests were built by ogres, you are met with five shrines. They are said to have been built around 1710, each enshrining a Namahage figure.

8 Ishiyaki



This lively fisherman's cuisine, with all the fragrance of the coast, features Oga seafood and seaweed cooked in a pot by dropping in a red-hot stone. Enjoy this dish at Cape Nyudozaki or Oga Hot Spring Village.

Babahera Ice Cream Ψ(パパヘラアイス




When the weather begins to warm, elderly woman can be seen outside event venues and along busy roadsides selling ice cream. Babahera is strawberry and banana flavored, with a texture similar to sorbet.











Lingering tradition holds that this hall was erected in 1714, About 12,000 Kshitigarbha statues carved of cedar wood line this hall, arrayed from the walls to the ceiling.

13 Cape Nyudozaki

A scenic spot on the northernmost tip of the Oga Peninsula, located at a northern latitude of 40 degrees overlooking the Sea of Japan. There is also a 28-meter high lighthouse here, selected as one of Japan's top 50 lighthouses.

Access: About 30 minutes by car from Oga Station









This popular spot is named for the rock blown here by an erupting volcano about 30 million years ago and shaped by erosion and weathering into a unique form resembling Japan's famous monster: Godzilla.

Oga Shottsuru Yakisoba _{男鹿しょっつる焼きそば}



Based on shottsuru fish sauce, the traditional seasoning of Oga, this regional specialty also features specially-made noodles including powdered wakame seaweed and kelp soup stock. It can be enjoyed at restaurants all over Oga City.

18 Oga Aquarium GAO _{男鹿水族館GAO}



GAO is home to about 10,000 marine animals across 400 species. The Oga Ocean Aquarium reproducing the surrounding oceans is enchanting. Among the attractions are energetic polar bears and delightful spotted seals.

15 Mt. Kanpuzan



Located on the east side of the Oga Peninsula, this spot affords a 360-degree view. The view from the Mt. Kanpuzan rotating observatory (admission fee applies) is also wonderful, offering a large panoramic view, which rotates completely every 13 minutes.



Believed to be messengers of the gods, Namahage are visiting spirits that go around family homes on New Year's Eve, preventing evil and bringing harvests and bountiful fishing catches. From the second Friday to the following Sunday in February, the Namahage Sedo Festival is held, in which the Namahage dance in front of burning bonfires.

This hall houses a Japanese rural earthen-floored space, hearthside, furnace, etc., where visitors can experience traditional farm work, food making, strawcraft making, etc. while chatting



Constructed approximately 1,200 years ago, the fortification was built to unify the area and functioned as a central base for local government and military, as well as serving as a location for ceremonies. The wooden walls stretch a vast 3.6 kilometres, enclosing an area of 87.8 hectares.

Daisen

This sprawling park, well-known for its cherry blossoms, follows the banks of the Sainai River behind rest area Nakasen Michi no Eki and around Mt. Yaotome. Walkways run throughout the park for strolling underneath the blossoms of the 2,000 cherry trees.



Kariwano Giant Tug of War

刈和野の大綱引き February 10

This festival of strength splits the town in two, each side numbering in the thousands. Participants pull either side of one of the largest ropes in Japanabout 80 centimetres in diameter, 200 meters in length, and weighing roughly 20 tons. While the massive rope strains and creaks, the struggle back and forward seems an endless battle, making for a powerful and spectacular sight,

6 Hideyoshi 秀よし(合名会社鈴木酒造店)



Dating back 320 years, this historic brewery is one of the oldest in the prefecture. Visitors can take a tour through the impressive interior, and sample a number of sake varieties. After finding one you like, bottles are available for purchase.

The giant zelkova standing in the temple precincts of Hozo-ji is said to be at least 950 years old, and boasts a trunk circumference and height of roughly 11 and 38 metres respectively. As one of Akita's most well-known and prestigious trees, its size overwhelms any who stand near it.

Everyday **Omagari** 毎日大曲



Select shop situated inside an 80-year old renovated pharmacy storehouse selling beautifully crafted Japanese fireworks and local products. Inside is also home to a lifestyle store that stocks regional design and artisan wares.

February

A local Lunar New Year festival where giant straw tenpitsu-vaki towers are lit ablaze while around 50 paper balloons of all sizes are cast into the night sky. Ota Fire Festival finishes with a fireworks display.

A shrine to a deity known for its strong ties to fertility and healthy birth. The space has an air of grandeur, built on stones piled in the center of a circular pond with 300 year-old cedar lining the main approach.

Based on the principal of rice before sake, the brewmasters pour their energy first into cultivating high-quality rice. Tour the brewery to understand their commitment to process, and see up-close the enormous steaming vats and koji room where mold spores are cultured.

Built in 1917, this traditional Japanese inn has been nationally designated as a Tangible Cultural Property, Historical construction methods can be seen throughout, such as the natural Akita cedar floorboards in the corridors and spacious 40 tatami banquet hall.

February 11

Bonden are festivals where large decorative poles* are offered to local shrines. Among the many bonden festivals throughout Japan, Daisen has the only one featuring a river-crossing. Teams sing while carrying their bonden around town, then cross the river by boat.

Venue: Hanadate area > Omono River > Mt. Izu Shrine *These poles, known as bonden, are a ceremonial item made by elaborately wrapping colourful cloth and paper on long wooden rods.





Standing without a single nail and adorned with intricate carvings, the shrine employs an exceptionally elegant method of construction. In 1950, it was nationally designated as an Important Cultural Property.

Access: About 10 minutes by car from Omagari Station









A pleasant spot to relax alongside the calm flow of Omono River backed by the striking Mt. Dake. Cherry blossoms blanket the riverbank in spring, and a 7,000 shell fireworks display is held here every year on September 14.

Kurashi no Rekishikan (大山市総合民俗資料交流館 くらしの歴史館



A cultural museum housed inside of an old elementary school that gives insight into Japanese life of yesteryear. Among the displays are immersive recreations of village streets and various agricultural, cooking and lifestyle items.

Sake here is brewed over a 60 day period at low temperature, developing a delicate flavour by employing the effects of natural yeast and lactic acid bacteria through the traditional yamahai method. The brewery itself is a historical building built in 1850, and visitors are able to take a tour of the brewing areas and fermentation room.

Access: About 8 minutes on foot from Jinguji Station Admission: Free (Requires a reservation via QR code on page 2. Tours only operate on weekdays and are unavailable between 1 October - 30 April. Sake not available for direct purchase.)








Local specialty made with ramen noodles in a Japanese soup usually found in udon or soba and topped with curry. The rich curry compliments the umami in the soup, culminating in an intense flavour unique to Omagari.

Ikeda Family Gardens Hotta Branch Gardens

Gardens of the Ikeda Family estate, one of Tohoku region's top three former landowners. Each season is painted on the numerous plants and trees, and visitors can also admire the spectacular Yukimi Stone Lantern and Western Manor. The Hotta Branch Gardens are located nearby.

Kakunodate Cherry Blossom Festival




Kakunodate is known as one of the top three cherry blossom spots in the Michinoku region of Tohoku. Cherry trees colour the town pink, running along the Hinokinai River and drooping gracefully either side of the main road through the Samurai District. The illuminated blossoms at night are also spectacular.







The deepest lake in Japan with a depth of 423.4 meters. Near the shore of the nearly circular Lake Tazawa, measuring about 20 kilometers around, is situated a bronze statue of Princess Tatsuko, who legend suggests turned into a lake spirit in hopes of eternal youth and good looks.

The Yama Event of Kakunodate Festival

The brilliant hand gesture dances accompanying the festival music are also a wonderful sight.

Kaba Craft Densho-kan



The cultural and historical traditions of Kakunodate are exhibited here, with a focus on kabaizaku woodcraft items made of cherry bark. Demonstrations of kabaizuku craft are also available, allowing visitors to view fine craftsmanship up close. Purchase of kabaizuku craft is also possible at the shop.

Aoyagi Samurai Mayor Museum

Inside the roughly 1,000m² estate there are six museums housing various historical artefacts of Kakunodate. There are also costumes available to try on including swords, helmets and traditional winter wear. Overlooking the garden is a retro cafe where visitors can relax.





Paper Balloon Festival of Kamihinokinai

上桧木内の紙風船上げ February 10

During this event, wishes are attached to huge paper balloons bearing painted depictions of samurai and beautiful women, which are then launched into the night sky so that the wishes might reach the heavens. The sight of 100 paper balloons being launched into the winter night sky is truly fantastic.

Venue: Ochida, Kamihinokinai, Nishiki-cho, Semboku-shi (Paner Balloon Square)







This ancient shrine was founded in 718. The shrine approach is an avenue of cedar trees over 350 to 800 years old and has been designated a natural treasure of the prefecture. The Nio guardian statue sculpted from a single massive cedar tree at the Niomon gate is a sight to see.

Tazawako Ski Resort たざわ湖スキー場

Known for the variety of courses and superior powder snow, the ski area offers sweeping panoramic views over Lake Tazawa. Mizusawa Hot Spring Village is located nearby, where you can warm your cold body in an onsen.

16 Okaribayaki ^{御狩場焼}

Okaribayaki is a dish of grilled meat and vegetables seasoned with Japanese pepper miso, which is served at restaurants in the town of Kakunodate. At the Kakunodate Shichibe restaurant, diners can enjoy the taste of okaribayaki with miso-baked Hinai-jidori chicken and seasonal vegetables served on hoba leaves.


20 Warabi Theater Akita Art Village あきた芸術村 劇団わらび座
